1. Introduction

3. Analysis

- **Unanimous Positive Feedback:** All 14 respondents confirmed that the school is fully compliant with safeguarding requirements, with clear identification of the DLP and DDLP, and comprehensive risk assessment procedures.
 - **Response Rate:** While the feedback is overwhelmingly positive, the response rate of 24.6% (14/57) indicates an opportunity to increase parent engagement in future surveys.
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4. Next Steps

To build on this positive feedback and ensure even broader parent involvement, the school will:

- **Celebrate Compliance:** Share these results with staff, parents, and inspectors to reinforce the school's commitment to safeguarding.
 - **Increase Engagement:** Offer alternative response methods (e.g., paper, phone), and consider incentives for participation for next survey.
 - **Transparent Reporting:** Include this report in the school's safeguarding documentation for inspectors and parents and print on website.

The survey results demonstrate a high level of confidence among responding parents in the school's safeguarding practices. The school remains committed to maintaining these standards and increasing parent participation in future feedback opportunities.

1. Introduction

This report summarises the findings of the pupil survey regarding feelings of safety, awareness of safeguarding procedures, and confidence in the school's response to concerns. The survey aimed to gather pupil feedback on the school's safeguarding environment and their understanding of support available. Results were gathered using Google Forms.

2. Survey Results

3. Analysis

- **Overall Safety:** The vast majority of pupils feel safe in school (92.5%) and on the yard (87.5%).
- **Awareness of Support:** Over 94% of pupils know who to tell if they don't feel safe, and who to talk to if they are worried for themselves or others.
- **Bullying Awareness:** 95% of pupils report that bullying has been discussed in class, and most know who to talk to if they experience bullying (92.1%).
- **Confidence in School Action:** While most pupils believe the school will act quickly on bullying concerns (84.6%) or other worries (82.1%), there is a slightly lower confidence in this area compared to others.

Qualitative Feedback:

- Some pupils suggested an anonymous box for reporting bullying.
 - A few comments indicated concerns about feeling unsafe or finding school hard.
 - Most feedback was positive, with comments like "No all perfect" and "It is safe."
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4. Next Steps

To address the feedback and further improve safeguarding:

- **Anonymous Reporting:** Introduce an anonymous box for pupils to report bullying or other concerns, as suggested.
 - **Reinforce Confidence:** Clarify and communicate the school's procedures for addressing bullying and other concerns, to increase pupil confidence in the school's response.
 - **Continue Dialogue:** Maintain open conversations about bullying and safety in class, and encourage pupils to voice any concerns.
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5. Conclusion

The survey results show a high level of safety and awareness among pupils, with most feeling confident in the school's safeguarding procedures. The school will act on the feedback to address any gaps and further enhance pupil well-being.
